


CHRISTMAS NEWSLETTER 2016



While still a young man, the tide of popular opinion turned against him. His friends ran away. One of them denied Him. He was turned over to His enemies. He went through the mockery of a trial. He was nailed upon a cross between two thieves. While He was dying, His executioners gambled for the only piece of property He had on earth – His coat. When He was dead, He was laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend.

Nineteen long centuries have come and gone, and today He is a centerpiece of the human race and leader of the column of progress.

I am far within the mark when I say that all the armies that ever marched, all the navies that were ever built; all the parliaments that ever sat and all the kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man upon this earth as powerfully as has that one solitary life.

the ministry often challenges our Biblical understanding, so here is a reflection on an issue very much in the forefront of our work:

Christmas, regretfully is a sad time for many people. Perhaps it is the contrast between their lives and the Christmas portrayed on every card or in every lavish advertisement. For everyone whose family gathers together, happy and well-fed, there are many for whom that is far from the reality. One story comes to mind:

A young woman recalled one childhood Christmas when her mother went 'into one' on Christmas Eve over some lapse by her errant father. She went around the house tearing down every decoration, pushed over and trampled the tree and then trashed every present. Now the young woman cannot look at a Christmas tree without fearing someone will attack it.

Of course, it was to bring healing that God took on flesh and became Immanuel, not to so we could have an annual binge, but to ensure an eternity when such hurt is washed away. His feast is everlasting and all are invited.

It is sad to hear that many people have such associations with Christmas, yet into that dread and despair is born hope. In the gospel, all can take comfort and be able to say as Paul did.

I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. (Romans 8:18)

I think we can accept this from a man who had personally experienced suffering (for the full list see 2 Corinthians 11:24-27)
