The Sermon by Rev Roy Lewis Read Nehemiah 3:1-14 and Luke 10:1-12 – Together

The last three Sundays we have been led through the first chapters of the book of Nehemiah. We have heard the context of the exile to Babylon of the Jewish people and all that they forfeited.

Much of the Old Testament is structured around this momentous event, and then the miraculous return of the people to their land, and particularly to Jerusalem to see the desecrated Temple rebuilt and restored and the walls of the city repaired, Together they met, heard the teaching of the Law of God; joined in His praise and worship and celebrated this great restoration.

It is not difficult for us to contextualise these happenings with our experience of recent years – the pandemic and lockdown(s). What a time that was and among many other hardship and deprivations, "Church" could not meet together. No public worship; prayer; fellowship, nor celebrating the sacraments of baptisms or Holy Communion. Then churches of our nation, along with many other nations were closed – no entry allowed.

We had not been deported to another land as had the Israelites, but our "Temple", God's people meeting together had been taken away from us.

Where are we now? We are in the position of rebuilding all that was taken away and of which we had been robbed.

The challenge facing us has been, and still is, great, and so this book of Nehemiah is vital reading and learning for us.

What can we discover specifically from chapter three?

1. Nehemiah great leader though he was could not do it alone.

2. The people – all of them needed to rally around, support, and with Nehemiah, build what was broken.

3. Some who should have known better refused to join in v 5.

4. Artisan craftspeople were engaged in major construction work with which they were unfamiliar and for which they had not been trained.

- 5. Both men and women were involved.
- 6. Many of them were engaged in work close to their homes.
- 7. Priests from other regions joined in to help.

For me, this is the key: -

BUILDING TOGETHER BY BEING TOGETHER!

Church attendance statistics tell us that although attendance in the UK is slowly recovering, the levels of already-low church attendance in 2019 have still not been achieved.

For many people, a fear of being together with the added risk of infection has been a significant factor. For others it appears they got out of the habit of going to church. An alternative provided through internet has been a good resource, and in many ways more convenient and for some preferable.

BUT it is NOT real church which is God's people being together.

"Forsake not the assembling of yourselves together" Hebrews 10:25

It is a huge challenge, but together we can rebuild what was broken down.

So, for those of us who are able, let us become available and -
