Read: John 13:31-14:14- God is Way, Truth & Life.

A summary of the talk given by Howard Wright.

Through the first half of his book John has carefully revealed Jesus as God, Messiah and King, and challenging us to believe. In this part of the book, Jesus with both an intimacy and a haste draws the disciples together, and prepares them for his coming death, and the implications of his resurrection and ascension.

Jesus has just washed his disciple's feet and now warns them that he will be leaving them but that in the meanwhile – there's a new command, love one another. This is not a new commandment, but a new take on a current one: see Leviticus 19:18. Jesus, adds, love, as I have loved you. How has Jesus loved us? Well, he has just washed disciple's feet, and he is about to be glorified (see 13:31-32) but this will be through crucifixion. We are supposed to love like this!



Like any classic bloke, Peter only hears Jesus' first comment, and in response to the announcement that he is leaving, asks, 'where are you going?'

Now, the disciples were probably still confused. Is Jesus going to gather troops for the new kingdom's assault. And 'why can't we come now? We've given up everything and followed you for three years — we don't want to miss out.'

Jesus points out they really can't come and as an aside warns Peter of his impending failure. He then makes plain his departure telling them of his return to his Father, and how that this is to prepare their future place, their home, their real home.

He tells them, that they know the way, and now Thomas, following Peter takes his turn at asking a silly question – 'we don't know where you're going how can we know the way?'

Jesus' response is staggering. John has prepared us for this though his Gospel, but this statement is still the philosophical and religious equivalent of an atomic bomb. Read John 14:6. There are so many implications in Jesus' statement:

Is Jesus deluded, mad, or arrogant? Well, no, he'd healed the sick, raised the dead, delivered the most brilliant moral teaching, and he's just, in an act of extraordinary kindness and servitude, washed the disciple's feet.

So, if Jesus is not deluded, mad, or arrogant, this is a statement that pins us to the wall with no escape or wriggle room – we must believe in him and follow, or we are rejecting him and the home he has for us.

Jesus is God, mighty God among us. Read Colossians 1:15-20.

Do we understand this? There is no negotiation here. This is not elitist, a just for few kind of thing, as Romans puts it, has made himself plain to us all.

And it is not intolerant – anymore than the truth always is. And it is fair to all other world views and religions, each claim to be true and unique, but there is only one who is the truth, just like there is only one answer to 2 + 2 – four, by the way!

Now Philip joins in with the daft questions that disciples ask and says: 'show us the Father.' Philip's question arises from a struggle to believe and understand the magnitude of who Jesus is and so Jesus makes it even more plain. 'Philip, come on, you know! The Father and I are one – I am God among you, the Word, become flesh.'

Jesus challenges Philip and therefore us, as does the whole Gospel of John, and indeed the whole Bible, to believe. 'Believe and do greater things' he says.

Do we, will we believe? Will we follow the way, believe, and live in the truth, and receive the abundant life of God?



Jesus offers such hope, a future which transforms our present.
Believe, receive, and live in love, or reject and lose direction, lose connection, home, and life itself. Do you know the Father, because there is a home for you.

Prayers: Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. (Philippians 4:4-6)



- Pray for this day, and the coming week.
- Pray for justice, mercy, peace, and hope.
- Pray for individuals, for neighbours, for family and friends.
- Pray for the Church.

Collect: 15th after Trinity: God, who in generous mercy sent the Holy Spirit upon your Church in the burning fire of your love: grant that your people may be fervent in the fellowship of the gospel that, always abiding in you, they may be found steadfast in faith and active in service; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**
