Read: John 8:12-30

God is here. *A summary of the talk given by Val Lucas.*

Summer holidays have begun, and everyone likes the sunshine and light summer evenings. We use light for lots of our celebrations, illuminations, candles, fireworks!

In this reading Jesus was in the temple for the feast of the tabernacle in the place where the lamps were lit to remind people of the pillar of fire that led them through the wilderness. It was here Jesus told the Pharisees I am the light of the world.



They were angry, Jesus continued, explaining he had seen the heavenly things he was speaking about. God his father had sent him to reveal such things. In Jewish law if two people agree about something their witness is accepted as fact. Jesus tells the Pharisees in words they can understand, I am one witness and my father who sent me is the other.

The Pharisees mocked him over his father as they knew his earthly father. To question a man's paternity was

regarded as a slur. Jesus was not provoked and said if you knew me, you would know my father also.

Jesus warned the Pharisees what would happen if they didn't believe, they would not follow him into heaven. He also challenged their behaviour.

We can learn two things from this reading. Firstly, we are to believe in Jesus and allow his light to shine through our lives exposing those things that are not of Christ. We will then find freedom, joy and a peace that surpasses all understanding.

Secondly Jesus was in the constant presence and light of his father. Our challenge is to immerse ourselves fully into this relationship. Do we trust completely or allow fear and darkness to creep in? Darkness comes in many forms, ill health, financial difficulties, relationship problems, etc.



However, one small birthday candle illuminates the faces of those gathered around a cake. Even a small amount of belief/faith will light up your world and give you hope. Jesus will never allow you to walk in darkness. Jesus is the light of the world. Have a good summer.
